Course News

Grass

Recently members commented about the length of the fairway grass being too short.

At this time, the grass height is the same as it has been for the past six months or more.

One factor that may give the impression that the height of the grass has been reduced is the rate of the growth.

The fairways are mown once per week and as the grass growth rate has been rapid due to the heat and rain, the height of the grass is variable from long before cutting to the standard height after cutting.

As always, the aim is to provide a course that is suitable for players at all levels. To meet this aim, we have set standards that are a balance between those preferring longer grass and those preferring shorter grass. It would be great if we could have both heights to satisfy all players but this is impossible.

A reminder: Members are asked if they have any concerns or queries about the course to please direct these issues directly to the Club Captain or members of the Greens Committee. Please do not address the greens staff about any course issues.

Practice Green

As you may have seen, work has continued on the new practice green.

Weather and resources permitting, we hope to finalise the work shortly and once the grass is established, the green will be available to the members.

Rule Change – Accidental Movement of a Ball on a Green

The Club has now introduced a new local rule in line with R&A Guidelines regarding the accidental movement of a ball on a green.

The rule is as follows:

No penalty will be applied, if:

- 1. When preparing to putt, you accidently cause the ball to move
- 2. You drop your ball causing the marker to move
- 3. You drop your ball marker causing the ball to move
- 4. You accidently move your ball when lifting your marker
- 5. You accidently kick your ball and it moves.

In all the above examples, the ball must be replaced on the original spot.

However, if you intentionally move or lift your ball on a putting green without first marking the ball, then a one stroke penalty will apply and the ball must be replaced.

This rule only applies to the greens and not the fairways, hazards, rough or surrounds.

Note: If it is determined that your ball on the putting green was moved because of wind, water or some other natural cause such as the effects of gravity, the ball must be played as it lies from its new location without penalty.

A ball-marker moved in such circumstances is replaced.

Chaplain's Corner by Peter Ball

I was on the eighth tee some years ago, when one of my fellow golfers was having a bad trot. I made the comment that this game is Character Building, hoping he might be somewhat encouraged.

However his quick response to that comment was, I've had enough character building thanks.

This put me in mind of comments on this subject by the Professional golfers, Jim Sheard and Wally Armstrong, found in their booklet entitled "Finishing the Course."

Quote:

"Golf is character-revealing if not a character-building game. In the final analysis, character is more important than how well we play the game. We often focus our attention on our successes, our accomplishments, our gains including the car we drive or the house we live in – and on whether we win or lose. We often seek titles, a higher income, and the next promotion. But what God cares about is our character. He uses challenges, or even difficult golf holes, to help develop our character.

Golf refines our character because we are unable to control or perfect our game. If we could achieve total control, then there would be no character building. Life is the same way. Because we cannot control the circumstances and outcomes, our character grows, and we learn to trust God.


Adversity can help bring our character in to conformity with God. With the right perspective, adverse experiences help refine our character into His likeness.
